CORONA VIRUS COMMISSION MEETING OFFICIAL REPORT

In addition to the decisions taken at the meeting of our University Senate dated 01/09/2021 and number 15, the issue of face-to-face education in the epidemic environment was evaluated in detail and the following decisions were taken for the 2021-2022 Academic Year Fall Semester.

Decision-01) Students and/or personnel who do not declare their vaccination card or PCR test result (with a negative result at least 72 hours before) are not admitted to our University Campus,

Decision-02) In case the lecturer/staff who conducts the course certifies that he or she is in contact with Covid-19, the course will be continued remotely until this situation disappears or the compensation will be made at a later date,

Decision-03) The suitability of the faculty member/staff to make up on Saturdays with the decision of the Board of Directors in case of Covid 19 or its contact,

Decision-04) Students have to indicate within 2 days that they have Covid-19 or their contact and/or they are in quarantine, and the attendance requirement is not sought from the said students in line with the Faculty Administrative Board's decision,

Decision-05) As long as our University's Regulations and Guidelines are available, students who are in contact with Covid-19 or who are in contact with the Faculty Administrative Board or Administrative Boards are taken to make-up exams for the exams, projects and quizzes they cannot take, provided that they are documented,

(The guidelines and principles in some of our departments say that some exams cannot be made up. In departments where the Guidelines and Procedures and Principles are available, the board of directors is authorized to decide on the attendance requirement and make-up exams.)

Decision-06) Conversion of that course to online (distance) education during the quarantine period, provided that at least 1 person in the class registered to the course at the same time in the classrooms in the undergraduate and associate degree programs is certified in case of Covid-19 or contact, and that the exams are conducted online, if any,

Decision-07) Everyone should wear a mask in accordance with the Ministry of Health's guide in all closed areas,

Decision-08) Security personnel to warn those who do not follow the mask and social distance rules by making constant checks in the university interiors and in the garden,

Decision-09) Students who are included in the list of the Ministry of Health, who have a chronic illness and who document this, are not required to attend face-to-face education,

Decision-10) Instructors who are listed by the Ministry of Health, who have a chronic illness and who document this, can take their courses online if they demand,

Decision-11) It is appropriate for our students to participate in technical or cultural trips within the framework of Covid 19 rules, provided that their responsibilities belong to them,

Decision-12) In the Fall Semester of the 2021-2022 Academic Year, the administrative boards of the relevant academic units will be authorized to make decisions for special situations that may arise outside of the above-mentioned issues regarding all educational activities under Pandemic conditions,

Decision 13) In controversial cases, this guide was updated with the decision to switch to face-to-face education in formal programs at universities as of the fall semester of the 2021-2022 academic year, published by the Council of Higher Education, and included the "Applications Guide for Education and Training Processes in the Global Epidemic" and the "Applications for the Campus Environment 2021" guide. October 17, 2021
